First Candle - The Candle of Hope
Abraham and the Old Testament Ancestors of Jesus

Leader: Today is the First Sunday of Advent, a day when we recall the hope in Christ held through faithful generations.

God told Abraham that through him all the nations of the world would be blessed. Trusting God, Abraham put his hope in this promise. The Old Testament spoke of the coming Savior who would be born a king in the line of King David. This Savior King would rule the world wisely and bless all the nations. We believe God's promise was fulfilled when Jesus Christ was born, and we believe Jesus will return again in the Second Coming of God's Messiah to establish his kingdom upon the earth.

(A person lights the First Candle here)

Hope is like a light shining in a dark place. As we look at the light of this candle, we celebrate the hope we have in our Lord and Savior Jesus Christ.

Leader: Let us pray:

God of Abraham and Sarah and all the Patriarchs of old, you are our Father too. Your love is revealed to us in Jesus Christ, Son of God, and Son of David. Help us in preparing to celebrate his birth; make our hearts ready to fully place our hope in you. Help us today and every day to worship you, to hear and obey your word, and to do your will by sharing your hope with others. We ask this blessing from you in the Name of the one who was born in Bethlehem. **Amen.**

Celebrant Let us give thanks to the Lord our God.

People It is right to give him thanks and praise.

Then, facing the Holy Table, the Celebrant proceeds

Celebrant God of all power, Ruler of the Universe, you are worthy of glory and praise.

People Glory to you for ever and ever.

Celebrant At your command all things came to be: the vast expanse of interstellar space, galaxies, suns, the planets in their courses, and this fragile earth, our island home.

People By your will they were created and have their being.

Celebrant From the primal elements you brought forth the human race, and blessed us with memory, reason, and skill. You made us the rulers of creation. But we turned against you, and betrayed your trust; and we turned against one another.

People Have mercy, Lord, for we are sinners in your sight.

Celebrant Again and again, you called us to return. Through prophets and sages you revealed your righteous Law. And in the fullness of time you sent your only Son, born of a woman, to

fulfill your Law, to open for us the way of freedom and peace.
